

# 2023 GEO Trust Fund Budget

*This document is presented to the 18th Plenary for approval.* 

The 2023 budget has been developed in consultation with the Budget Working Group using the implementation mechanisms of the GEO Strategic Plan 2016-2025: Implementing GEOSS, and based on the requirements of the GEO Secretariat Concept of Operations Document 2022-2023, adopted by the Executive Committee in September 2021.

### 2023 GEO Trust Fund Budget

#### **INTRODUCTION**

This document contains the presentation of the proposed 2023 GEO Trust Fund Budget.

#### PRESENTATION OF THE 2023 GEO TRUST FUND

The GEO Trust Fund supports the operations of the GEO Secretariat, the only body within the GEO governance structure that brings a daily all-encompassing view across the breadth of GEO activities. The Secretariat plays an essential role in not only the coordination and facilitation of the GEO Foundational Tasks, but it also engages with diverse stakeholders, advocates the importance of Earth observations, negotiates in-kind contributions to the Work Programme and facilitates cooperation amongst organizations throughout the GEO community.

The basis of the 2023 Trust Fund Budget continues to be in accordance with the Implementation Mechanisms described in the Strategic Plan (GEO Strategic Plan 2016-2025: Implementing GEOSS). The Secretariat role in the Strategic Plan is further defined in the GEO Secretariat Concept of Operations (2022-2023) approved by the GEO Executive Committee September 2021.

The budget has been devised to show expected funding by cash and/or through in-kind secondments to cover the programme of work, roles and positions defined by the Concept of Operations.

In addition to the budgeting of the Concept of Operations, the Secretariat envisages drawing on Trust Fund reserves in 2023. These funds will be used to fund tasks related to the Post-2025 period, upgrading communications supports, and preparation for the 2023 Ministerial Summit.

#### 2 EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### 2.1.1 Note 1 - Salaries and Employee Benefits

A table containing the required Secretariat Staff resources for 2023 is found in Annex 1.

Short term resources are funded by using the available cash reserves of the GEO Trust Fund. These positions are temporary positions to execute the additional work burden of the effort to prepare GEO for the post 2025.

Not all defined positions will be resourced using trust fund resources and therefore there is still a demand for secondments to fulfil these requirements. The secretariat has two full time secondments in place.

#### 2.1.2 Note 2 Travel

The allocation for secretariat travel has been defined using the CONOPs documents as the guiding principles on how the Secretariat is organized to meet the strategy and objectives for 2023.

An additional allocation for the sponsoring travel of developing county representatives to GEO governance meetings (Executive Committee and Plenary) has been envisaged.

### 2.1.3 Note 3 Supplies, Consumables and Other Running Costs

The 2023 Budget includes a provision of CHF 400,000 for communications innovations projects. In preparation for the next phase of GEO, the secretariat envisages to overhaul current communications resources, such as the Website and associated document management systems. The funding of this provision is from the available resources held in the Trust Fund.

# ANNEX 2 REPORT OF THE BUDGET WORKING GROUP 2022

#### 2021 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND AUDIT REPORT

The Budget Working Group BWG noted the 2021 Financial Statements and Audit report. The external auditors have provided an unqualified opinion or clean audit for the fiscal year 2021. The BWG noted that the Trust Fund had adequate reserves to cover long and short-term liabilities. They also noted an increase in the available working capital and additional reserves.

#### PROPOSED 2023 GEO TRUST FUND BUDGET

The BWG met to discuss the proposed 2023 Budget, they agreed to the proposal to allocate around 1,55 million on short-term resources for the preparation for the ministerial and post 2025 process. They also noted the allocation of 400,000 for communications innovations to support the efforts of the Secretariat to improve communications and outreach. This will also contribute to an innovative campaign for increased resources for the trust fund for 2023 and beyond.
