

Report from the Pacific Islands Advisory Group

This document is submitted by the Pacific Islands Advisory Group to the Programme Board for discussion.

The report that follows was previously presented to the GEO Executive Committee at its 55th meeting (July 2021). It outlines the progress made by the PIAG to develop its Work Plan and proposes a draft Engagement Strategy to support delivery against the PIAG Terms of Reference. Going forward, PIAG will report to each Programme Board meeting in addition to its reporting requirements to the Executive Committee.

1 INTRODUCTION

Pacific Island Countries and Territories (PICTs) have significant and increasing exposure to disaster risk, climate change and sustainable development challenges. In 2020, the GEO Executive Committee convened the Pacific Islands Advisory Group (PIAG) to advise the GEO Programme Board and the GEO Executive Committee regarding the implementation of the elements of the Canberra Declaration for the PICTs.

Since the last report from the PIAG to the Executive Committee, the PIAG held two teleconferences with the full membership on 15 December 2020 and 25 May 2021, and two teleconferences of the co-chairs prior to each of the full meetings.

In this document, the PIAG presents an initial draft of its Engagement Strategy for Executive Committee review and comment.

2 A GEO ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY FOR THE PICTS

The PIAG has developed a draft outline of an Engagement Strategy (see Annex A) that identifies a series of actions and opportunities intended to increase and improve opportunities for connections between GEO and the PICTs. The outline is based on the PIAG Work Plan (see Annex B), and its key elements are directly linked to the PIAG terms of reference.

The Engagement Strategy highlights links between high level goals of GEO and the PICTs. Reading from left to right, vertical columns represent components, with each component building upon the former block. They are: Listed Deliverables (from the PIAG terms of reference), Activities (what PIAG and the GEO community may do, dependent on resources and priorities), Outputs (anticipated deliverables) and Outcomes (the long-term impact). Horizontal rows outline what might be undertaken in order to progress. For instance, if these Activities are implemented, then these Outputs are expected to be achieved, which in turn, will lead to these long-term Outcomes.



The PIAG proposes an inclusive approach to engaging with PICTs and relevant Participating Organisations and will capitalize on regional meetings and working groups (including Asia-Oceania GEO, the Pacific Geospatial and Survey Council, and the Pacific Islands GIS and Remote Sensing Users Group) to the fullest extent possible. During the implementation of the Engagement Strategy, PIAG members will continue to participate in, support, and connect the various activities underway for the PICTs. However, it is not proposed that the PIAG should oversee or directly implement these activities. While the details of implementation are yet to be determined, it is expected that implementation will be led by a mix of PICT-based regional organizations, GEO Work Programme activities, Asia-Oceania GEO, and other means. This reflects PIAG's status as an advisory body to the Executive Committee and the Programme Board.

3 NEXT STEPS

Following the Executive Committee discussion, the PIAG will prepare the full Engagement Strategy to address the comments received and to further delineate the expected implementation mechanisms for the Strategy.
